Preparing For The CAASPP

When we return from our Intersession & Spring Break all of our third through fifth grade students will be participating in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress, or CAASPP, statewide testing program. The assessment window will begin on Monday, April 23rd. These tests will provide important information for our teachers, students and parents about our schools and individual student's progress and their readiness for college and career.

The CAASPP system assesses English Language Arts and Mathematics for grades 3-5 through the Smarter Balanced state assessment. Smarter Balanced state assessments are based on the California Content Standards, for Mathematics and English Language Arts. In addition students in grades 5 will also take the California Science Test, CAST. Parents can use these results as one of many indications of their child's performance. The Valley staff also use these results to compare our schools' performance towards achieving our state standards. After this testing cycle, we will have three years of results which will assist us in measuring the growth of our students toward the goal of career and college readiness for all students.

A Message from the School Counselor - Veronica Tapia

"If our kids aren't safe, they can't learn." I would agree with the Principal that made this statement at the School Safety Community Forum. Safety is our number one priority and as a team, I am proud of the work and partnership PUSD has with our staff, students, families, and the community, in order to keep our schools safe. For those who were not able to attend the forum, there is a new confidential tip line for PUSD schools that is monitored by law enforcement: 844-PUSD-TIP (1-844-787-3847). Student safety and mental health concerns can still be reported to PUSD's internal hotline as well: 858-668-4161. If it is an emergency please dial 9-1-1.

If you have concerns about your child, and feel that they may need assistance to cope with school stress, family changes, peer relationships, etc.; please feel free to contact me, at 858-748-2007 ext. 2107. I'm on site Monday's, Tuesday's and half day Friday's. I can provide you with additional support and resources, or you can contact the **San Diego Access and Crisis Line** at 1-888-724-7240.

The district also has a family resource center known as, The **Caring Connections Center** (CCC), and they provide a free 90 minute family conference that offers an action plan along with additional resources, such as, connecting families with community therapists based off of the families insurance. There are two school counselors that work at this center and I am one of them. So if I am not at Valley, you can also reach me at CCC. The phone number to the Caring Connections Center is 858-668-4084.

After a stressful event or tragedy it's always important to care for yourself, in order to care for your child and to be the role model for how to cope. Pay attention to your own feelings of grief, anger or anxiety. Then lean on others, find healthy coping strategies and/or seek additional support when needed. Here are a few steps that I gathered from the Mayo Clinic, to help your child process such stressful events:

- •Remain calm.
- •Reassure your child of his or her safety.
- Limit media exposure.
- Avoid placing blame.
- Maintain the routine.
- •Spend extra time together.
- •Encourage the expression of feelings.
- •Seek out school resources.
- •Do something for those affected by the tragedy.


