


From the Desk of Dr. Johnsen ~ Andy Johnsen, Ed. D.

Valley Team atScience Field Day ~

On May 9, 2015 Valley Elementary sent a team of 15 to compete in SDCOE's Science Field Day (along with about 50 other elementary schools). The San Diego County Office of Education Science Field Day is a wonderful district wide competition dedicated to teaching science and engineering and fostering the love of science to last a lifetime.

Fourth and Fifth grade students trained for 14 weeks in their subjects to compete in 15 science related events (Structures, Changing Earth, Starry Starry Night, Mirror Magic, Don't Bug Me, Circuit Wizardry, Catapult Competition, Triathlon Relay, Perplexing Powders, Rocking Out, Simple Machines, Tin Can Racers and Anatomy). The event has a festival atmosphere with many "day of" science demonstrations and competitions. Valley students learned so much about their subjects and working as a team. Valley earned 13 awards (including 4 first place medals).

The Valley 5-minute check-in


Please continue to ask your children positive open-ended questions when they return home from school. Some examples of the Valley 5-minute check-in include:

Having this conversation with your child teaches them to have empathy, and it provides them with the opportunity to develop solutions.
